

Twenty-two years ago, a group of thirteen local volunteers worked together to create Lubec's centerpiece park on land leased by the town, known today as 'Flatiron Corner.' Their work included planting gardens and a pine tree now used as the town's Christmas Tree; and included a small kiosk, utilized freely by merchants to promote their wares and by local organizations to publicize their activities. Very few of the original thirteen remain with us today, but their vision lives on.

The kiosk, attractive as it was, has outlived its construction and now needs to be replaced. APPLE, the Association to Promote and Protect the Lubec Environment, a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation, has taken on the task of honoring the vision of the original thirteen, while preparing to meet the needs of the future. We need to raise \$7,000 to replace the structure.
